Welcome to Peniel Baptist Academy! We are so glad that you have chosen to begin the application process to enroll your child at this school ministry.

- ✓ The first step to enroll your child in Peniel Baptist Academy is to complete the attached registration forms and pay the required registration fee.
- ✓ Next, all prospective students are required to take an entrance exam (K-12th). You will sign up for a test date at the time you turn in your registration form and fee.
- ✓ Also, **the parent(s) and child** must attend and participate in a personal interview with the administration. You will also sign up for this interview date at the time you turn in your registration form and fee.
- ✓ On the date of the entrance test, parents must provide the school with the following items:
 - Current report card and previous credits
 - Recent standardized tests (Stanford Achievement Test, FCAT, etc.)
 - Copy of birth certificate
 - Copy of Social Security Card
 - Shot record (Florida Blue Card with current immunizations)
 - School Entry Health Exam (DH 3040)
- ✓ Once the testing and interview process is completed, the school will notify prospective parents concerning their acceptance status. All other enrollment requirements (which will include a signed Statement of Agreement) will be discussed at the start of school.

Dear Prospective K-12th Parents,

Peniel Baptist Academy is a participant in the Florida Corporate Tax Credit Scholarship Program (CTC) which offers tuition and book scholarships to eligible low-income families of K-12th grade students. Currently, the CTC program pays for a student's tuition, books, and other school fees up to \$3,950. Parents are also responsible for all fees that exceed this amount (does not include daycare or lunches).

PBA will continue to teach students using the Bible-based, Christ-centered ABEKA curriculum. The ABEKA curriculum is a phonics-based, advanced program of learning that has been used at Peniel to prepare kids with excellence for over thirty years.

Participation in the CTC program is not automatic. Children's First Florida manages the Corporate Tax Credit Scholarship Program for Putnam County. To be eligible your child must meet the following criteria:

1. Be a Kindergartener or First Grader, or
2. If you have any children going into grades 2 through 12 in August 2009 on this application, have at least one of those children attended a Florida public school since October 1, 2008 up through March 11, 2009, and, and
3. Your total family income in relation to the size of your household must be at or below the following table:

4. If your family meets the above criteria, your child or children may be eligible for the CTC scholarship.
5. **To apply, go online at www.scholarshipfunding.org.** Click on "Children First Florida" and complete the application. Before you start this process, you should have the following information with you at the computer:
 - Your 2008 1040 tax return if anyone in your household earned income in 2008. (Your 2008 W-2's/1099's if you have not filed taxes but earned income).
 - ALL Social Security benefit letters for everyone in your household specifying the monthly benefit for 2008 or 2009 if your household is supported by Social Security income.
 - Child support documentation for all of your children specifying how much you actually receive monthly if you are designated to receive child support.
 - The calculated amount of all 2008 financial assistance received.
 - Accurate Social Security numbers for ALL household members
6. Children First Florida will make the final determination through a review of your application responses and the supporting copies of documentation that you will be required to submit to their eligibility processing company, Florida Processing Services (FPS), along with a non-refundable processing fee of \$25.
7. Once eligibility is determined by FPS and Children First Florida receives notification, **they will release a SCHOLARSHIP AWARD LETTER** for all eligible children in your family. The scholarship will only cover the tuition and books as of the date you receive the letter. Please be careful to apply far enough in advance so as to receive your letter before school starts.
8. Parents bring this letter to Peniel who will apply the scholarship to your child's account. As stated above, the CTC program pays for a student's tuition and book fees up to \$3,950. Parents are responsible for tuition and book fees that exceed this amount. Parents are also responsible for all fees that exceed this amount (does not include daycare or lunches).

We hope this information has helped you as prepare for the registration process at PBA. Please remember that PBA has no control on scholarship acceptance with Children's First. PERMISSION TO PADDLE

(The intent of this form is not to offend those parents who do not approve of paddling, but to offer this as an option for those parents who still believe in the use of paddling.)

4. It shall be administered privately with an adult witness present.

Internet and Computer Use Policy & Consent Waiver Form
4th grade – 12th grade

Rights of Peniel Baptist Academy

The Internet is a “public place.” Students must always remember they are sharing this space with many other users. Potentially millions of individuals at the same time may be interacting across the network. Others can monitor your actions on the network. If a student uses a particular service on the network, chances are good that someone knows the connections that you are making, knows about the computer shareware that you have borrowed, and knows what you looked at while you were in the system. Because these connections are granted to you as part of the larger scope of curriculum the school reserves the right to monitor all traffic on the network. We do this to make sure that the school network will continue to function properly for all of its users.

School Conduct Codes

Peniel Baptist Academy has a behavior code for all students that details appropriate Christian conduct, outline rights, and sets expectations for students. The school’s code of conduct applies to network activities as well. Therefore, the network “use policy” is an extension of the school’s behavior code. The rules apply to vandalism of computer equipment, unauthorized access to information, computer piracy (downloading software), hacking (accessing school records), and any tampering with hardware or software, etc.

These rules also apply to the electronic use of harassing and abusive or obscene language. You may not use the network to annoy, harass, or offend people. You also may not use the network resources to display or distribute obscene or sexually explicit pictures or language.

Other types of damage and information loss to a computer system are viruses and worms. If you are responsible for a computer becoming infected with viruses or worms, you will be held liable.

Moral and Ethical Issues

The moral and ethical issues involving the use of worldwide information systems deal with the appropriate access to information, the type of information, and the behavior of the user. Peniel Baptist Academy wants to provide you with a stimulating educational environment, but at the same time, we want to protect you from information that is not appropriate for students to use.

PBA wants you to use this valuable educational tool, but at the same time we cannot condone the use of inappropriate information on the Internet. We simply acknowledge the fact that these materials exist and then do everything we can to actively avoid them. **We cannot weed out all of the materials that are unacceptable for a particular student, but it should be clearly understood by all students that access to such material in any form is strictly forbidden.** The computer system/network is designed to achieve and support instructional goals and any information that does not support classroom learning is to be avoided.

Although the actual percentage of unacceptable materials is small, it can cause concern for students and parents if a student stumbles onto the information while doing legitimate research. If you have a question or concern regarding any information you find, contact your teacher or computer lab operator.

Electronic Libraries

Guidelines for access to information have already been established in the Library Bill of Rights in 1980. These principles can be applied to the Internet. This document states: “attempts to restrict access to library materials violate the basic tenets of the Library Bill of Rights.”

However, school librarians are required to devise collections that are: “consistent with the philosophy, goals and objectives of the school.”

This means that students have the right to information but PBA has the right to restrict any information that does not apply to the approved curriculum.

It is not unreasonable to consider the Internet as a vast digital library. The electronic databases and information search tools it uses have become part of school media centers and libraries, and most public libraries offer some type of network access as part of their services.

Expected Behavior when using PBA Network Resources

The more users there are on a network, the more congested that network becomes. If there are too many users at any given time, the traffic on the network grinds to a crawl, just like a traffic jam on a freeway. Some users may be cut off altogether. Although the network may slow down, it continues to function. The following may help to avoid the “gridlock.”

- ♦ Do not tie up the network with idle activities (for educational use only)
- ♦ Do not play games with others on the network or on the Internet. (Networks are not designed for computer games. A network is not Playstation. Play games on your own time and on your own computer.)
- ♦ Do not download files without teacher permission. Only take information that you need.

In addition, we as the school administration want you to learn new things and share that knowledge with your friends, your parents and your teachers. However, when you are using the computer, it is your responsibility to keep the following restrictions in mind:

- ♦ **PBA does not allow students to send or receive e-mail. Students may ask teachers to e-mail for them but it can only be for educational research and correspondence.**
- ♦ **At NO time may student enter or participate in any chat room or interfaces such as My Space, Face Book or other such sites.**
- ♦ Do not give out personal information of any kind over the Internet (this includes name, address, home phone number, etc.)
- ♦ Always follow appropriate and polite Internet behavior.
- ♦ Do not trespass, edit or delete another person’s folders, work or files.

Legal Issues

A. The Law

On August 1, 1979, Chapter 815 of the Florida statutes, "The Florida Computer Crimes Act" went into effect. This act describes the circumstances under which the unauthorized use of computer equipment, services, or accounts may be prosecuted as a misdemeanor of the first degree, felony of the third degree, or felony of the second degree with penalties ranging from 1 to 15 years of imprisonment and fines of \$1,000 to \$10,000. Listed below is one example from three areas of concern found in the Florida statutes (please visit Florida Statutes 815 for further details):

- (1) Willfully, knowingly, and without authorization destroys data, programs, or supporting documentation residing or existing internal to a computer system, or computer network commits an offense against intellectual property.
- (2) Willfully, knowingly, and without authorization destroys, takes, injures, or damages equipment or supplies used or intended to be used in a computer, computer system, or computer network; or whoever willfully, knowingly, and without authorization destroys, injures, or damages any computer, computer system, or computer network, commits an offense against computer equipment or supplies.
- (3) Whoever willfully, knowingly, and without authorization accesses or causes to be accessed any computer, computer system, or computer network; or whoever willfully, knowingly, and without authorization denies or causes the denial of computer system services to an authorized use of such computer system services, which, in whole or part, is owned by, under contract to, or operated for, on behalf of, or in conjunction with, another commits an offense against computer users.

Anyone committing acts of this kind will face legal charges and disciplinary action by Peniel Baptist Academy.

Some examples of offenses are removing another user's accounts, changing other user's passwords, using an unauthorized account, damaging any files, altering the system, or using the system to make money illegally. You cannot cause damage to any school property. This includes the network system.

B. Plagiarism

The dictionary defines plagiarism as "taking ideas or writings from another person and offering them as your own." The student who leads readers to believe that what they are reading is the student's original work when it is not is guilty of plagiarism. **Credit should always be given to the person who created the article or the idea.** Be careful when using the Internet. Cutting and pasting ideas into your own document is very easy to do. So, be sure that you give credit to the author. That way your teacher will know which ideas are yours, and you won't be guilty of plagiarism.

C. Copyright

Copyright is another issue altogether. According to the Copyright Act of 1976, "Fair Use" means that you may freely use any information that you legally find on the Internet as long as you do so for scholarly purposes. You may not plagiarize or sell what you find.

Suppose, for example, that you find a copy of Microsoft Works on the Internet. Could you legally copy it? The answer is no. This is copyrighted software. You have to purchase software packages before you use them legally. Suppose you find an article about the use of Microsoft Works on the Internet, can you legally copy it? The answer is yes, as long as you give credit to the author and do not sell the article for profit.

Further, my parents or guardians and I have been advised that PBA does not have control of the information on the Internet, although it attempts to provide prudent and available barriers. Other sites accessible via the Internet may contain material that is illegal, defamatory, inaccurate or potentially offensive to some people. While the intent of Peniel Baptist Academy is to make Internet access available to further its educational goals and objectives, network users will have the ability to access other materials as well.

PBA believes that the benefits to educators and students from access to the Internet, in the form of information resources and opportunities for collaboration, far exceed any disadvantage of access. But ultimately, the parents and guardians of minors are responsible for setting and conveying the standards that their student should follow. To that end, Peniel Baptist Academy supports and respects each family's right to decide whether or not to apply for network access.

Any questions should be directed to the Administrator and the student and his/her parent or guardian must understand that student access to the school's network is being developed to support the educational responsibilities and mission of our school. The specific conditions and services being offered will change from time to time. In addition, PBA make no warranties with respect to the school network service, and it specifically assumes no responsibilities for:

- A. The content of any advice or information received by a student from a source outside the school or any cost or charges incurred as a result of seeing or accepting such advice;
- B. Any costs, liability or damages caused by the way the student chooses to use his/her school network access;
- C. Any consequences of service interruptions or changes, even if those disruptions arise from circumstances under the control of the school.

By signing this form, I agree to the policies and terms as set forth by PBA including:

1. My use of the school network will be consistent with the school's primary goals and mission.
2. **I will not use the school network for illegal purposes of any kind.**
3. **PBA cannot weed out all of the materials that are unacceptable, but it is clearly understood that access to such material that is Biblically, morally and ethically inappropriate in any form is strictly forbidden.**
4. I will not use the school network to transmit threatening, obscene or harassing materials. The school will not be held responsible for any such activities.
5. I will not use the school network to interfere with or disrupt network users, services, or equipment. Disruptions include, but are not limited to, distribution of unsolicited advertising, propagation of computer worms and viruses, and using the network to make unauthorized entry to any other machine accessible via the network. I will print only to my local printer.
6. Information and resources accessible via the school network are private to Peniel Baptist Academy who owns and holds rights to those resources and information. **Therefore, I will not use the school network to access information or resources unless a PBA teacher has granted permission.**
